## **Examples of plastics**

- Plastic bottles and drums
- Plastic trays and jars
- Plastic bags
- Plastic film
- Bubbles wrap

Plastics must be emptied of their content and/or scraped clean.



### Examples of food & beverage cartons

- Milk and yoghurt cartons
- Cartons for juices and similar
- Cartons for food such as tomatoes and beans.

Food & beverage cartons must be emptied of their content and/or scraped clean



- Rice, pasta, and cheese
- Vegetables and fruit raw, cooked and
- Tea leaves, coffee grounds (with filters and bags)
- Fish, meat, cold cuts, and bones

Food waste must be placed in bags. Please tie your bag with a knot.



### Examples of residual waste

- Gift wrap paper and bows
- Pizza boxes
- Cardboard mugs and to-go cups
- Soiled paper
- Vacuum cleaner bags
- Nappies

Residual waste must be placed in bags. Please tie your bag with a knot.

# **GLASS**

### **Examples of glass**

- Glass bottles from wine
- Glass packaging from pickles, instant coffee and jam
- Glass bottles from ketchup and salad dressing

Glass must be emptied of their content and/or scraped clean.

Do not put glass items in bags - put



# **Examples of metals**

- Beverage cans
- Preserve cans
- Capsules from tea light candles
- Aluminium trays
- Bottle caps and lids

Metals must be emptied of their content and/or scraped clean.

Do not put metals items in bags - put them loose in the container.

# **Examples of paper**

- Newspapers, junk mail and weeklies
- Magazines and brochures
- Office paper and envelopes

Paper must be clean and dry.

Do no put paper in bags - put them loose in the container.



# SMALL CARD-**BOARD ITEMS**



### Examples of small cardboard items

- Cereal boxes
- Corrugated cardboard and carton
- Rolls from tissue and toilet paper

Cardboard must be clean and dry.

Do not put cardboard in bags - put it loose in the container.
